LOS ANGELES – 9 FEBRUARY 2023 – PhillipsX and Artadia are proud to announce an upcoming Los Angeles selling exhibition of works by California-based Artadia Awardees, Terri Friedman, Esteban Ramón Pérez, Adee Roberson, and Miller Robinson. The exhibition will be open to the public from 13 February through 9 March at the

recently launched Phillips Los Angeles. The Artadia Awards program is designed to both provide artists with essential funding and recognition along with bolstering their communities and advocating for pathways to careerbuilding opportunities. The four Artadia Awardees featured in this exhibition have demonstrated pivotal moments in their practice, and the works included in the show represent how the artists' respective histories, identities, and relationships to materials uniquely manifest in their art.

Terri Friedman (she/her)

Terri Friedman's work responds to the current climate of anxiety and uncertainty by enlisting color, abstraction, and text to explore topical issues and personal narratives. Friedman made a mid-career transition to weaving in 2014 which has since become an extension of her practice of investigating painting without paint. She explores with fiber the brain-body connection, mental health, and our ability to rewire from psychological and physical trauma. Friedman received her BA from Brown University and her MFA from the Claremont Graduate School.



Esteban Ramón Pérez (he/him)

Paying homage to his roots, Esteban Pérez approaches his practice as an interrogation and excavation of his subjective memory, spirituality, fragmented history, and social political reality. Esteban received his BFA in Art from the California Institute of the Arts, and his MFA in Painting and Printmaking from Yale University School of Art. He lives and works in Los Angeles, CA.



Adee Roberson (she/they)

Adee Roberson is an interdisciplinary artist whose work is a meditation on symbolism and texture. Synthesizing performance and installation, her work melds vibration and technicolor visions through paintings, video, and melodic compositions. These works offer a refracted timeline of black diasporic movement, weaving sonic and familial archives, with landscape, rhythm, and spirit. She is based in Los Angeles, California.



Miller Robinson (they/them)

Miller Robinson is a 2Spirit, transdisciplinary artist of Karuk, Yurok, and mixed-European descent working and residing on unceded Tongva Territory. Tethered by sensibilities that prioritize collaboration, storytelling and the passage of nonlinear timelines, themes of growth, transfiguration, temporality, and stewardship are routine to their practice. They work in constant dialogue with the state of materials and experiences, informed by a lineage of basket weavers and fix-the-earth People. Through performance, sculpture, and books, they incorporate poetry, tattooing, garment-making and site-specific installation to create detailed ecosystems within exhibitions that seek out horizons in Queer and Trans potentialities. Robinson received their BFA from Otis College of Art and Design in 2014.
